






Introduction

Universities are a key action in defining and implementing such strategies, and therefore, have had to make an effort to plan strategic plans that would enable alignment with these policies and European regions.

Objectives







Digital Repository



The Digital Repository of Documents UAB collects, manages, preserves and disseminates scientific, educational and institutional digital documents that are part of the collective collections of the UAB libraries. It brings together a wide range regarding media, themes and types of documents. DDD always includes metadata describing the resource and access to full text.


